



Sustainability

Income generation

The Social Enterprise will aim to generate income and build 3/6 months reserves by:

- Providing skilled staff for care and support to be funded by service users
- The submission of applications to trusts and other grant giving bodies
- Seeking tendering opportunities to secure other contracts for service delivery
- Trading its holiday breaks (asset transfer dependent), selling retail and other donations online
- Developing a domestic cleaning/housekeeping service which provides people with learning disabilities the opportunity to gain skills which will increase employability
- Fund raising by volunteer supporters

Partnerships

- Partnering other voluntary sector and/or private providers to extend Person Centred Planning facilitation supporting the expanding personalisation agenda
- Partnering other voluntary sector providers to develop young people's independence such as the extension of Travel and Life Skills Training
- Working with young carers and siblings of disabled children and young people through partnership with other third sector organisations
- Working with other providers of adult services
- Working with housing associations to develop Homeshare

Health

- Working with health colleagues to support children and young people with more complex health needs
- Engaging with Clinical Commissioning Groups
- Engaging with the Young Foundation
- Engaging with colleagues in Public Health

Recruitment

- Developing a pool of Personal Assistants who would then be engaged directly by parents/carers. Where parents/carers have no wish to become employers, Entrust Care Partnership would employ the staff and take responsibility for management, support and training. A fee to cover costs would be charged for this service
- Employing parents and carers and building their skill base/capacity via training and other opportunities
- Offering work placements to disabled adults and young people with a view to securing more permanent employment

ICT

- Web or retail based toys and equipment exchange/sales with a focus on children and young people
- Web based accessible holidays ~ developing our mobile home portfolio further through vetting/organising/booking holidays for people with disabilities

Accountability

There is a differentiation of roles with one acting as Chair and taking responsibility for strategic development and company growth, one taking the lead on marketing, research and promotional aspects and the third having an overview of finance and income generation. All Directors, staff and volunteers will work to support families by actively seeking continuous feedback from service users.

The ultimate accountability for service delivery and associated matters will rest with the Board of Directors, who will meet every six weeks. The Directors will be supported by the Parent and Carer Forum, Family Voices Warwickshire and it is anticipated that the activities of Entrust Care Partnership will be an Agenda item on the Forum meetings every quarter.
